ITINERARY

DAY 1: TUE 30 SEP 25 - CASABLANCA

Arrive at Casablanca Airport and transfer to your hotel. Settle in and meet up with your group in the evening.

DAY 2: WED 1 OCT 25 - CASABLANCA, RABAT AND TANGIERS

Visit the grand Hassan II Mosque in Casablanca then stop by the never-completed Hassan Tower and the royal tombs in Rabat. Walk the colourful streets of the Kasbah des Oudaias. Arrive in Tangiers and look out to the view of the Strait of Gibraltar. (B)

DAY 3: THU 2 OCT 25 - TANGIERS

This morning visit the Cave of Hercules, often considered a symbol of Tangiers. Later discover the many Phoenician artefacts at the Kasbah Museum and be guided through Tangiers' lively medina. Enjoy free time to wander the medina and the city's array of wonderful shops and cafes. (B)

DAYS 4 & 5: FRI 3 & SAT 4 OCT 25 CHEFCHAOUEN

Head eastward to the quaint village of Chefchaouen, known for its stunning, blue-washed houses, and settle in for two nights. Explore the town, take photographs, hike the surrounding hills for some stunning views, or just relax, immersed in the magic that is Morocco. (2B)

DAY 6: SUN 5 OCT 25 - VOLUBILIS, MOULAY IDRIS AND MEKNES

Continue southward and then stop to traverse the well-preserved ruins of the Roman city of Volubilis, where the archaeological remains of several civilizations are evident. Enjoy a coffee at the holy city of Moulay Idriss, named for the great-grandson of the Prophet Muhammad. Arrive in Imperial Meknes and be guided through the great storerooms of Moulay Ismail, the stunning Dar Jamai Museum and the Bou Inania Madrasa. (B)

DAY 7: MON 6 OCT 25 - SEFROU AND FES

Call in to the virtually untouched town of Sefrou and be guided through its ancient medina and Jewish Quarter. Arrive in Fes and settle in to the traditional riad, home for two nights. Later, delve into the old city and see Funduk Nejjarine, an historic caravanserai and now a museum located in the heart of the medina. (B)

DAY 8: TUE 7 OCT 25 - FES

The morning is for admiring the local artisans who create intricate Zellij tile mosaics. Next, soak up one of Morocco's most memorable sights: the celebrated Tanneries and coppersmith's souk of Fes. Here animal hides are treated in vats of lime and urine before being dyed in vivid colours. Enjoy a free afternoon to wander, to shop, and maybe enjoy a hammam. (B)

DAY 9: WED 8 OCT 25 - IFRANE, ER RACHIDA AND ZOUALA

It's a lengthy drive south today between the Atlas and Anti-Atlas Mountains to Er Rachida and onto the tiny village of Zouala in the Ziz Valley. Pass through Ifrane and marvel at its Swiss-style chalets and alpine villas. Tonight stay in a family-run, traditional hotel in the heart of Zouala Village. (B,D)

DAY 10: THU 9 OCT 25 - MERZOUGA AND THE SAHARA

Following breakfast enjoy a walk through Zouala village and palmery and on route to Merzouga explore the very old and crumbling Ksar Maadid, noted for its architecture and historical importance. Visit the frontier-like market town of Rissani then check in to accommodation where there's time for a swim before a sunset camel ride over the Saharan dunes. (B,D)

DAY 11: FRI 10 OCT 25 - JEBEL OUGNAT AND N'KOB

Take a rarely travelled route through the spectacular region of the Jebel Ougnat, an extension of the Anti-Atlas. It is a spectacular region and home to the Ait Atta, who still practice traditional agriculture, growing crops, almonds and dates and tending to goats and sheep. Enjoy a guided tour through the village and palmery of N'Kob before settling in around the Kasbah Hotel's pool. (B,D)

ITINERARY

DAY 12: SAT 11 OCT 25 - TAMNOUGALT AND TAMDAKHT

Journey through the lush Draa Valley and discover the impressive 16th century ksar at Tamnougalt which served as a caravan stop along the trans-Saharan trade routes. Enjoy a guided tour before continuing via Ouarzazat to Tamdakht to check in to the fabulous kasbah-style hotel for the next two nights. (B,D)

DAY 13: SUN 12 OCT 25 - AIT BENHADDOU AND TAMDAKHT

This morning visit the nearby World Heritage listed Ait Benhaddou. Feel a part of some ancient world or in a blockbuster movie at this staggeringly beautiful site. After lunch Return to Tamdakht to relax, take photos or swim in this magical setting. (BD)

DAY 14: MON 13 OCT 25 - TELOUET AND ESSAOUIRA

Travel is long today, over the High Atlas Mountains. Drive to Telouet and view the remains of the Kasbah of Glaoui, (badly damaged in the 2023 earthquake) and then cross over the Tizi 'n Tkchha pass at 2260m, to the charming coastal city of Essaouira. The town was once an important trading seaport, linking Marrakech and sub-Saharan Africa with Europe and the rest of the world. Once checked in, enjoy a delicious dinner at one of the many seafood restaurants in Essaouira. (B)

DAY 15: TUE 14 OCT 25 - ESSAOUIRA

Take a guided walk around the old walled medina, an outstanding example of an 18th century fortified town. The rest of the day is yours to relax and wander around this pretty and historic town. Retire to the hotel in the heart of the old medina and enjoy a hammam or spa treatment. (B)

DAY 16: WED 15 OCT 25 - MARRAKECH

After breakfast drive to Marrakech. The afternoon is at leisure. Time to walk to and immerse yourself in the celebrated Jemaa el Fna square and its nearby souks. An optional Moroccan cookery class can be arranged for those interested. (B)

DAY 17: THU 16 OCT 25 - MARRAKECH

Enjoy a half day walking tour of Marrakech and visit the Saadian Tombs, the mausoleum of the ruling Saadian dynasty of the 16th & 17th centuries. Marvel at the architectural masterpiece that is the Bahia Palace and later, be inspired at the superb Photographic Museum. This afternoon search and haggle for the last of your Moroccan souvenirs or grab a taxi to see the Majorelle Garden and the Yves Saint Laurent Museum (optional). (B)

DAY 18: FRI 17 OCT 25 - MARRAKECH

Breakfast concludes your tour. Taxis to the airport are available, or Byroads can organise a transfer on request. (B)

BOOKING CONDITIONS

RESERVATION AND DEPOSIT

A non-refundable deposit of \$750 is payable on all tours. This deposit must be paid to Byroads, and each participating client must complete the Byroads Booking form. You agree to accept these conditions when paying a deposit for your tour and completing the Booking Form. Your Byroads tour booking will only be confirmed once the deposit and completed booking form have been received. These Booking Conditions form the basis of the contract between you and Byroads.

PAYMENT

All payments must be made directly to Byroads by bank transfer.

FINAL BALANCE

The balance of your tour payment is due 60 days prior to the start of your tour. If, for any reason, the balance payment is not received by the due date, Byroads reserves the right to treat such failure to pay the balance as a cancellation and to apply the appropriate cancellation charges.

CANCELLATION BY YOU

If, for any reason, you cancel your tour booking, Byroads shall apply the following cancellation penalties. Charges are per person:

- Cancellation up to and including 60 days prior to departure, forfeiture of the total deposit
- From 59 to 45 days prior to departure, 30% of the tour price shall be retained
- From 44 to 31 days prior to departure, 50% of the tour price shall be retained
- Within 30 days prior to departure, no refund will be made.

In addition to the above charges, cancellation fees may also apply to any domestic airfare component of your tour. No refund will be made after your tour has commenced or in respect of lost or unused tickets, hotel coupons, meals or any other services not utilized.

CANCELLATION BY BYROADS – Prior to Travel

If, for any reason, Byroads is forced to cancel a tour before it commences, Byroads may offer a transfer to an alternate departure, or all monies paid by you in respect of the tour will be refunded, less any unrecoverable costs. Unrecoverable costs may include but are not limited to monies paid to service providers, airlines, transportation companies, travel agencies and hotels associated with your tour.

AMENDMENTS

Up to and including 60 days prior to the departure of your tour, any amendment to a confirmed reservation may incur a fee of \$50 per change per file. From 59 to 30 days prior to departure, any amendment to confirmed travel arrangements may incur a fee of \$100 per change per file. Once documents have been dispatched, any amendment may incur a fee of \$150 per change per file.

TOUR PRICES

Byroads tour prices and provisional tour prices are based on tariffs and prevailing rates of exchange when tours were costed. Prices are subject to change without prior notice. In the event of fluctuations in currency exchange rates, service providers' tariffs, fuel prices or any other cost that affects the price of your tour, Byroads reserves the right to adjust tour prices at any time up to the day of departure.

TOUR OPERATION

Although Byroads will endeavour to ensure that tours are operated as advertised, an express condition of making a reservation is the acceptance by you that the tour itineraries, schedules, advertised accommodation, sightseeing and mode of transportation as outlined in the Byroads brochure and/or supplied in the pre-departure information are subject to change without prior notice.

Unforeseeable circumstances such as force majeure, epidemic, pandemic, adverse weather conditions, floods, earthquakes, airline flight rescheduling, technical faults with transportation and road conditions may also have a consequential effect on the tour's content. Any decision made in respect of tour services provided by Byroads to reroute or amend the itinerary due to the above or similar circumstances shall be at the sole discretion of Byroads. Byroads shall not be liable for any claim whatsoever arising from such events that affect the schedule and content of your tour.

If Byroads is forced to cancel your travel arrangements after your trip has commenced due to reasons outside of its control, it will provide you with a refund of recoverable third-party costs only.

HEALTH AND FITNESS

Byroads operate soft adventure tours. All participants must have a reasonable degree of physical fitness and be healthy. Before travelling with Byroads, you must familiarise yourself with any health requirements applicable to the areas you will be travelling. This includes obtaining any compulsory vaccinations or medical tests that may be required for entry into your country of travel.

You are responsible for having the correct entry and exit documents for your visiting countries. Byroads will assist in providing up-to-date information but is not responsible for any changes that may be made by governments.

ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

You acknowledge that the nature of the tour is adventurous and that participation involves a degree of personal risk. You will be visiting places where the political, cultural and geographical attributes can present dangers and physical challenges greater than those present in our daily lives. We use information from foreign government departments and reports from our own contacts in assessing whether the itinerary should operate. However, you must acquaint yourself with all relevant travel information and your itinerary. You acknowledge that your decision to travel is made considering this information, and you accept that you are aware of the personal risks attendant upon such travel.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

Ensure your passport has a minimum of six months validity remaining, as this is an entry requirement in many countries. Upon booking, visa requirements will be advised once Byroads has received your passport details. Visas are required for a number of our tours, and it is your responsibility to obtain them.

ITEMS NOT INCLUDED IN TOUR COST

The cost of your Byroads tour does not include international airfares, airport departure taxes, unspecified meals, optional sightseeing, additional transfers, gratuities for hotel staff, guides and tour leaders, items of a personal nature such as laundry, phone calls, etc. or any other incidental expenses.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

It is an express condition of travelling with Byroads that you have comprehensive travel insurance to cover you for the duration of your tour. This should include full cover for any medical expenses and repatriation if required. It is highly recommended that you take out travel insurance when you pay the deposit to guard against any unforeseen circumstances that can lead to your need to cancel your tour. If you rely on complimentary travel insurance offered through your credit card company or bank, you should ensure that it is suitable for your tour. Some of the policies offered by these institutions may not offer adequate coverage. You must provide the policy number, insurance supplier details and emergency contact number to Byroads before your documents are issued.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

We contract with a network of companies, government agencies and individuals to assist in the running of our tours as agent for these third parties. We are not responsible for the acts and omissions of these third parties. To the fullest extent permitted by law:

(i) Any liability for any loss, death, injury or damage which you may suffer (directly or indirectly) in connection with or arising out of your participation in a tour, or any breach of the Booking Conditions, is excluded;

(ii) You release Byroads and its officers, employees, agents and representatives from any liability and expressly waive any claims you may have against us arising out of, or in connection with, your participation in a tour;

(iii) Any condition or warranty which would otherwise be implied by law into these Booking Conditions (Implied Warranty) is excluded.

To the extent an Implied Warranty cannot be excluded, our liability in respect of the Implied Warranty is limited to (in our absolute discretion): (a) the provision of a similar tour to an equivalent value or (b) a refund of the total amount received by us from you in connection with your booking.

Any claim by you is excluded to the extent that it is for indirect or consequential loss, loss of profits or economic loss (however it arises) or for indirect, special, punitive or exemplary damages.

APPLICABLE LAW

The laws of Victoria, Australia, govern these Booking Conditions to the fullest extent allowable. Any disputes in connection with a tour or these Booking Conditions must be initiated in the courts of Victoria.
