DAY 1: FRI 23 OCT 2026 - BUENOS AIRES

Arrive at Buenos Aires International Airport where you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Settle in and meet up with your group in the evening.

DAY 2: SAT 24 OCT 2026 - CITY SIGHTSEEING BUENOS AIRES

Today you'll explore the vibrant highlights of Buenos Aires, one of South America's most charismatic capitals. Visit some of the city's most iconic neighbourhoods, including colourful La Boca, known for its strong Italian immigrant heritage and artistic flair. Along the way, take in architectural masterpieces such as the world-renowned Colón Theater, the grand National Congress, the emblematic Casa Rosada presidential palace, and the soaring Obelisco–each telling a part of Argentina's rich political and cultural story. (B)

DAY 3: SUN 25 OCT 2026 - CITY SIGHTSEEING BUENOS AIRES

This morning, visit the elegant Recoleta district, famed for its French-style architecture and status as one of Buenos Aires' most upscale residential areas. Explore the remarkable Recoleta Cemetery, where iconic figures like Evita Peron are entombed amidst ornate mausoleums. Discover the lively cultural scene with museums and art spaces that enrich the neighborhood's charm. Then, continue to Palermo, the city's largest neighborhood, celebrated for its vast parks, exclusive avenues, and a vibrant culinary scene featuring some of Buenos Aires' finest bars and restaurants – perfect for soaking up the local atmosphere. Returning to the "Downtown" there is time this afternoon to wander the famous San Telmo Street Market. It's enormous. (B)

DAY 4: MON 26 OCT 2026 - BUENOS AIRES - PUERTO IGUAZU - FOZ DO IGUACU-PUERTO IGUAZU

This morning, fly to Puerto Iguazu to explore the breathtaking Iguazu Falls, one of the world's most spectacular natural wonders. Cross the border into Brazil and visit Foz do Iguacu National Park, where panoramic viewpoints and walkways provide stunning vistas of nearly all the falls, including the thunderous 'Garganta del Diablo', or Devil's Throat. The sheer power and scale of the falls here create an unforgettable sensory experience. After soaking in the magnificent scenery, return across the border to the Argentine town of Puerto Iguazu, where you will spend the night, reflecting on the day's incredible sights. (B)

DAY 5: TUE 27 OCT 2026 - IGUAZU NATIONAL PARK

Start the day with a guided trip into the heart of Iguazu National Park. Begin at the visitor centre to get a sense of the park's incredible ecosystem, then hop aboard the open-air train or take a peaceful walk along the Green Trail through lush forest. First, explore the lower trail, where walkways wind through the jungle and bring you face to face with the thunder and spray of the falls – an unforgettable, close-up encounter. Next, follow the upper trail, which offers sweeping views over the falls and the vast canopy below. With the roar of the water still in your ears, return by train and head back to your hotel in Puerto Iguazu to relax after a thrilling day in nature. (B)

DAY 6: WED 28 OCT 2026 - PUERTO IGUAZU - BUENOS AIRES - EL CALAFATE - EL CHALTEN

Following breakfast, head to the airport for your flight to Buenos Aires and connect onwards to El Calafate airport, gateway to Patagonia. From here, travel overland through wide open steppe and dramatic mountain views to the charming village of El Chalten, nestled at the foot of the Fitz Roy range. Known as Argentina's trekking capital, this small town offers a relaxed vibe and stunning natural surroundings. Settle in and soak up the fresh mountain air ahead of tomorrow's adventures. (B)

DAY 7: THU 29 OCT 2026 - MORNING HIKE TO LOS CONDORES & LAS AGUILAS VIEWPOINTS

This morning, cross the Fitz Roy River and follow a well-marked trail from the National Park Visitor Centre to the Los Cóndores viewpoint. It's a relatively easy walk to a spectacular lookout over the Fitz Roy range, and a prime spot to watch condors glide across the sky. Return back along the trail where a signposted fork leads to the Las Águilas trail – a gentle path opening onto vast views of Lake Viedma, the steppe, and distant peaks like Cerro Huemul and Cerro Piramide. After soaking up the stunning scenery, return to El Chalten for a free afternoon – perfect for a relaxed stroll, an optional short hike, or simply enjoying the fresh mountain air. (B)

DAY 8: FRI 30 OCT 2026 - MORNING HIKE TO DEL TORRE LOOKOUT - EL CHALTEN - EL CALAFATE

Enjoy a rewarding morning hike through the Fitz Roy River valley to one of the region's most iconic viewpoints. Pause at Margarita lookout for breathtaking views of Mt. Torre, the Adela range, and the Solo hills, as well as the cascading Margarita waterfall across the gorge. Continue through lenga forest and along the river until you reach the Del Torre viewpoint – a sweeping panorama of jagged granite spires and the dramatic icecovered peaks of the Torre massif. After soaking in the scenery, return to El Chalten where following lunch its time for a transfer to El Calafate, three hours drive away. (B)

DAY 9: SAT 31 OCT 2026 - FULL DAY EXCURSION TO PERITO MORENO GLACIER - EL CALAFATE

Travel across the vast Patagonian steppe along the southern edge of Lake Argentino, passing into Los Glaciares National Park where the landscape shifts to lush Andean forest. Stop at a panoramic viewpoint for sweeping views of the Andes and the first sight of the mighty Perito Moreno Glacier. Then, explore the network of balconies and walkways that offer unforgettable views from above, beside, and even eye-level with the glacier's towering ice walls. Later, board a one-hour boat cruise for an up-close look at the glacier's stunning face before returning to El Calafate for the night. (B)

DAY 10: SUN 1 NOV 2026 - OPTIONAL EXCURSIONS - EL CALAFATE

Today is your free day to enjoy El Calafate however you like. Whether you want to relax, explore local shops, or enjoy a coffee with a view, the choice is yours. If you're feeling adventurous, there are some fantastic optional excursions to consider. Two of the most popular options are detailed below. To ensure you don't miss out, we recommend booking any optional tours when you reserve your Byroads trip – or your Byroads Escort can arrange them easily on Day 1 in Buenos Aires. (B)

Hotel Quijote (or similar)

Option 1 - Estancia Nibepo Aike

Prepare for a full-day adventure on a traditional Patagonian ranch, where you'll get an authentic experience of rural life. Learn about the history of the estancia and the pioneer family who still manage it today. Admire impressive gaucho skills, watch a shearing demonstration, and enjoy a hike or optional horseback ride to La Angostura, the stunning point where Roca Lake and Argentino Lake meet. The day culminates with an unforgettable lunch featuring a traditional Patagonian lamb barbecue (asado). The visit includes about 5 hours at the estancia, plus approximately 2½ hours of transfer time. Approximate Current Cost: From USD \$200 per person

Option 2 - All Glacier Navigation

If the glaciers have captured your imagination, the All Glaciers Navigation is a must. This full-day cruise on a modern, comfortable catamaran takes you deep into the remote arms of Lake Argentino. Sail through iceberg-dotted waters to witness from a safe distance the vast Upsala Glacier and glide past the towering face of Spegazzini Glacier–the tallest in the park at 140 metres high. Along the way, you'll spot other impressive ice formations like the Seco, Heim, and Peineta glaciers.

Disembark at the Spegazzini Base and stroll a gentle forest trail to the panoramic refuge, with stops at themed viewpoints covering glaciology, wildlife, and local history. Enjoy spectacular views, browse the shop, and soak up the atmosphere before cruising back-an unforgettable day amid Patagonia's icy giants.

DAY 11: MON 2 NOV 2026 - EL CALAFATE - BUENOS AIRES - MENDOZA

This morning, depart El Calafate and fly north via Buenos Aires to the celebrated wine region of Mendoza. Nestled at the foot of the Andes, Mendoza is renowned for its Malbecs, sunny climate, and laid-back charm. On arrival, meet your local guide and transfer to your centrally located hotel –perfectly positioned to explore the city's leafy streets, plazas, and vibrant dining scene. (B)

DAY 12: TUE 3 NOV 2026 - MENDOZA CITY TOUR - WINERY VISIT - CLUB TAPIZ

This morning, explore the city of Mendoza with a guided tour through its historic heart. Stroll along treelined streets and the lively Sarmiento pedestrian zone, visit the ruins of the old Jesuit church, browse the Central Market, and admire civic buildings like the Ministry of Culture and San Martín Passage. Enjoy a walk through the beautiful San Martín Park before heading to the Cerro de la Gloria for sweeping views and the striking Monument to the Army of the Andes.

In the afternoon, journey into the lush wine country that has made Mendoza famous. This fertile region– an oasis at the foot of the Andes – is the cradle of Malbec. Travel through the Lujan de Cuyo and Maipu regions, where grand old vineyards sit alongside modern wineries and country estates. Visit two distinct wineries with a local expert, tour their vineyards and cellars, and enjoy tastings that showcase the region's finest vintages. Return to Club Tapiz, your relaxing winery hotel for the night. (B)

DAY 13: WED 4 NOV 2026 - OLIVE OIL FARM VISIT - WINERY VISIT - CLUB TAPIZ

This morning, enjoy a private half-day visit to a boutique winery and an olive oil farm in the heart of Mendoza's wine country. As you explore the tranquil olive groves, you'll learn about traditional and modern methods of cultivation and production. Guided tastings let you sample a range of premium oils-perhaps comparing varietals and discovering the secrets behind extra virgin quality. Mendoza is home to some of South America's best olive oil producers, and this experience is a real treat for food lovers. At the winery, gain insight into the grape-to-glass journey with a visit to the cellars and vineyards, capped off by a relaxed tasting of local vintages. Return to Club Tapiz for a peaceful afternoon with time to unwind and enjoy the hotel's serene rural setting. (B)

DAY 14: THU 5 NOV 2026 - MENDOZA - ACONCAGUA PROVINCIAL PARK-RINCONADA

Today we bid farewell to Argentina and journey west through the mighty Andes, crossing into Chile. Along the way, we stop at Aconcagua Provincial Park for unforgettable views of Mount Aconcagua, the highest mountain in the Americas, standing at a staggering 6,962 metres. There's time to stretch your legs on a short, scenic hike to Horcones Lagoon, a peaceful glacial-fed lake nestled beneath snow-capped peaks (approx. 2.6km). This relatively easy walk offers stunning photo opportunities and a chance to experience the grandeur of the Andean landscape up close. Continuing the journey, we descend into Chile's Aconcagua Valley, eventually reaching the outskirts of the small town of Rinconada. Here we check in to a lovely winery hotel, surrounded by vineyards and mountain views – an ideal spot to unwind after a day in the high mountains. (B)

Howard Johnson de Los Andes (or similar)

DAY 15: FRI 6 NOV 2026 - RINCONADA - WINERY TOUR - SANTIAGO DE CHILE

After breakfast, visit El Escorial winery, nestled in the Andean foothills. Enjoy a guided walk through its historic grounds and Romanesque-arched cellar, followed by a tasting of four Gran Reserva wines-two reds, a Late Harvest, and the estate's emblematic label. Later, travel to Santiago for lunch and a city tour. Drive along Alameda Avenue past the 16th-century San Francisco Church, then enjoy sweeping views from Santa Lucía Hill. Explore the charming Lastarria district with its cafés and cultural flair. Stop at La Moneda Palace, the elegant former mint of the Spanish Crown, then stroll down Paseo Ahumada to the lively Plaza de Armas, home to the Cathedral and historic museums. Cross the Mapocho River to vibrant Bellavista and finish with a cable car ride up Cerro San Cristóbal for panoramic city views. (B)

DAY 16: SAT 7 NOV 2026 - SANTIAGO DE CHILE

Both Latam Airlines and Qantas have airfares to Buenos Aires and return from Santiago. These are the most direct flights. You can book these on-line or via your travel agent.

Your arrival transfer is included however, your departure transfer is not. Byroads can organise a departure transfer on request.

BYROADS TOUR BOOKING CONDITIONS

RESERVATION AND DEPOSIT

A non-refundable deposit of \$1000 is payable on all tours. This deposit must be paid to Byroads, and each participating client must complete the Byroads Booking form. You agree to accept these conditions when paying a deposit for your tour and completing the Booking Form. Your Byroads tour booking will only be confirmed once the deposit and completed booking form have been received. These Booking Conditions form the basis of the contract between you and Byroads.

PAYMENT

All payments must be made directly to Byroads by bank transfer.

FINAL BALANCE

The balance of your tour payment is due 60 days prior to the start of your tour. If, for any reason, the balance payment is not received by the due date, Byroads reserves the right to treat such failure to pay the balance as a cancellation and to apply the appropriate cancellation charges.

CANCELLATION BY YOU

If, for any reason, you cancel your tour booking, Byroads shall apply the following cancellation penalties. Charges are per person:

- Cancellation up to and including 60 days prior to departure, forfeiture of the total deposit
- From 59 to 45 days prior to departure, 30% of the tour price shall be retained
- From 44 to 31 days prior to departure, 50% of the tour price shall be retained
- Within 30 days prior to departure, no refund will be made.

In addition to the above charges, cancellation fees may also apply to any domestic airfare component of your tour. No refund will be made after your tour has commenced or in respect of lost or unused tickets, hotel coupons, meals or any other services not utilized.

CANCELLATION BY BYROADS – Prior to Travel

If, for any reason, Byroads is forced to cancel a tour before it commences, Byroads may offer a transfer to an alternate departure, or all monies paid by you in respect of the tour will be refunded, less any unrecoverable costs. Unrecoverable costs may include but are not limited to monies paid to service providers, airlines, transportation companies, travel agencies and hotels associated with your tour.

AMENDMENTS

Up to and including 60 days prior to the departure of your tour, any amendment to a confirmed reservation may incur a fee of \$50 per change per file. From 59 to 30 days prior to departure, any amendment to confirmed travel arrangements may incur a fee of \$100 per change per file. Once documents have been dispatched, any amendment may incur a fee of \$150 per change per file.

TOUR PRICES

Byroads tour prices and provisional tour prices are based on tariffs and prevailing rates of exchange when tours were costed. Prices are subject to change without prior notice. In the event of fluctuations in currency exchange rates, service providers' tariffs, fuel prices or any other cost that affects the price of your tour, Byroads reserves the right to adjust tour prices at any time up to the day of departure.

TOUR OPERATION

Although Byroads will endeavour to ensure that tours are operated as advertised, an express condition of making a reservation is the acceptance by you that the tour itineraries, schedules, advertised accommodation, sightseeing and mode of transportation as outlined in the Byroads brochure and/or supplied in the pre-departure information are subject to change without prior notice.

Unforeseeable circumstances such as force majeure, epidemic, pandemic, adverse weather conditions, floods, earthquakes, airline flight rescheduling, technical faults with transportation and road conditions may also have a consequential effect on the tour's content. Any decision made in respect of tour services provided by Byroads to reroute or amend the itinerary due to the above or similar circumstances shall be at the sole discretion of Byroads. Byroads shall not be liable for any claim whatsoever arising from such events that affect the schedule and content of your tour.

If Byroads is forced to cancel your travel arrangements after your trip has commenced due to reasons outside of its control, it will provide you with a refund of recoverable thirdparty costs only.

HEALTH AND FITNESS

Byroads operate soft adventure tours. All participants must have a reasonable degree of physical fitness and be healthy. Before travelling with Byroads, you must familiarise yourself with any health requirements applicable to the areas you will be travelling. This includes obtaining any compulsory vaccinations or medical tests that may be required for entry into your country of travel.

You are responsible for having the correct entry and exit documents for your visiting countries. Byroads will assist in providing up-to-date information but is not responsible for any changes that may be made by governments.

ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

You acknowledge that the nature of the tour is adventurous and that participation involves a degree of personal risk. You will be visiting places where the political, cultural and geographical attributes can present dangers and physical challenges greater than those present in our daily lives. We use information from foreign government departments and reports from our own contacts in assessing whether the itinerary should operate. However, you must acquaint yourself with all relevant travel information and your itinerary. You acknowledge that your decision to travel is made considering this information, and you accept that you are aware of the personal risks attendant upon such travel.

PASSPORTS AND VISAS

Ensure your passport has a minimum of six months validity remaining, as this is an entry requirement in many countries. Upon booking, visa requirements will be advised once Byroads has received your passport details. Visas are required for a number of our tours, and it is your responsibility to obtain them.

ITEMS NOT INCLUDED IN TOUR COST

The cost of your Byroads tour does not include international airfares, airport departure taxes, unspecified meals, optional sightseeing, additional transfers, gratuities for hotel staff, guides and tour leaders, items of a personal nature such as laundry, phone calls, etc. or any other incidental expenses.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

It is an express condition of travelling with Byroads that you have comprehensive travel insurance to cover you for the duration of your tour. This should include full cover for any medical expenses and repatriation if required. It is highly recommended that you take out travel insurance when you pay the deposit to guard against any unforeseen circumstances that can lead to your need to cancel your tour. If you rely on complimentary travel insurance offered through your credit card company or bank, you should ensure that it is suitable for your tour. Some of the policies offered by these institutions may not offer adequate coverage. You must provide the policy number, insurance supplier details and emergency contact number to Byroads before your documents are issued.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

We contract with a network of companies, government agencies and individuals to assist in the running of our tours as agent for these third parties. We are not responsible for the acts and omissions of these third parties. To the fullest extent permitted by law:

(i) Any liability for any loss, death, injury or damage which you may suffer (directly or indirectly) in connection with or arising out of your participation in a tour, or any breach of the Booking Conditions, is excluded;

(ii) You release Byroads and its officers, employees, agents and representatives from any liability and expressly waive any claims you may have against us arising out of, or in connection with, your participation in a tour;

(iii) Any condition or warranty which would otherwise be implied by law into these Booking Conditions (Implied Warranty) is excluded.

To the extent an Implied Warranty cannot be excluded, our liability in respect of the Implied Warranty is limited to (in our absolute discretion): (a) the provision of a similar tour to an equivalent value or (b) a refund of the total amount received by us from you in connection with your booking.

Any claim by you is excluded to the extent that it is for indirect or consequential loss, loss of profits or economic loss (however it arises) or for indirect, special, punitive or exemplary damages.

APPLICABLE LAW

The laws of Queensland, Australia, govern these Booking Conditions to the fullest extent allowable. Any disputes in connection with a tour or these Booking Conditions must be initiated in the courts of Queensland.
