# ITINERARY

## **DAY 1: FRI 15 MAY 2026 - ADDIS ABABA**

Arrive at Addis Ababa International Airport where you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Settle in and meet up with your group in the evening.

## **DAY 2: SAT 16 MAY 2026 - CITY SIGHTSEEING ADDIS ABABA**

Begin the day with a visit to the excellent National Museum of Ethiopia, where ancient artefacts and royal treasures tell the story of one of the world's oldest civilizations. Highlights include the famous fossil 'Lucy'—a fascinating link to humanity's earliest ancestors. From here, admire the elegant Holy Trinity Cathedral, with its striking stained glass and imperial tombs, offering a glimpse into Ethiopia's religious and royal heritage. Inside the cathedral is the tomb of Haile Selassie I who was the Emperor of Ethiopia from 1930 to 1974, known for modernizing the country and promoting African unity. Later, dive into the vibrant chaos of the Mercato, a sprawling marketplace alive with colour, sounds and the hum of daily life—an unfiltered look at contemporary Addis Ababa. The day concludes at the Red Terror Martyrs Memorial Museum, a sobering yet essential stop that adds powerful context to the country's recent past and its journey forward. In the evening join in for a vibrant cultural performance and traditional Ethiopian feast. (BD)

## **DAY 3: SUN 17 MAY 2026 - ADADI MARIAM - MELKAKONRIE - ADDIS ABABA**

After breakfast, journey south through the rolling countryside to Melka Kunture, a key prehistoric site overlooking the Awash River Gorge. This significant archaeological location has yielded numerous Stone Age tools and offers a fascinating glimpse into Ethiopia's earliest human history. Continue to the remarkable 12th-century rock-hewn church of Adadi Mariam, believed by tradition to have been built under the orders of King Lalibela himself. Though damaged in the 16th century and later abandoned, it was restored during the reign of Menelik II and remains an active place of worship today. On the return to Addis Ababa, ascend into the forested Entoto Hills for panoramic views across the city. Before the day ends, visit the Hadero Coffee Company to witness the full journey from bean to brew, then savour a tasting of rich, authentic Ethiopian coffee—grown, roasted and brewed at the source. (B)

## **DAY 4: MON 18 MAY 2026 - DIRE DAWA - AWEDAY MARKET - HARAR**

This morning, fly east from Addis Ababa to Dire Dawa, gateway to Ethiopia's far eastern highlands. From here, travel overland to Harar, pausing en route to visit one of the region's lively khat markets—where bundles of freshly harvested stimulant leaves are traded with fervent energy. Arrive in Harar in time for lunch, before heading out to explore the narrow alleyways and colourful homes of this ancient walled city, considered the fourth holiest city in Islam and a centre of cultural exchange for centuries. As evening descends, gather to witness one of Ethiopia's most unique and unforgettable traditions: the nightly feeding of the wild hyenas just outside the ancient city walls. (B)

## **DAY 5: TUE 19 MAY 2026 - HARAR - DIRE DAWA - ZIWAY - LAKE LANGANO**

After breakfast, travel back to Dire Dawa for your return flight to Addis Ababa. On arrival, rejoin your 4x4 vehicles and begin the journey south through Ethiopia's dramatic Rift Valley. En route, stop near Ziway to visit one of the world's largest flower farms, a vibrant and unexpected oasis of colour in the heart of the region. From here, continue to Lake Langano, a tranquil retreat known for its scenic setting. Arrive in time to relax and enjoy the peaceful lakeside atmosphere before settling in for the night. (B).

## **DAY 6: WED 20 MAY 2026 - ABIJATA SHALA N.P. - SHASHEMENE - BALE MOUNTAINS LODGE**

Begin the day with a guided walk through Abijata-Shala National Park, where you may encounter ostriches, Grant's gazelles, warthogs and a wide range of birdlife. From here, continue south to Shashemene, a town steeped in Rastafarian culture and spiritual heritage. Visit a local Rasta centre to gain insight into this global movement that found a spiritual home in Ethiopia.

# ITINERARY

The journey then climbs across the dramatic Sanetti Plateau—one of Africa's highest road-accessible landscapes—where sweeping views and possible wildlife sightings make for a stunning drive. Arrive at Bale Mountains Lodge, nestled deep in the Harennna Forest, where you'll enjoy a two-night stay immersed in nature. (BD)

## **DAY 7: THU 21 MAY 2026 - SANETTI PLATEAU - HARENNNA FOREST WALK - BALE MOUNTAINS LODGE**

Set out for a full day on the extraordinary Sanetti Plateau, a high-altitude Afro-Alpine landscape at over 4,000 metres. With its otherworldly flora—including towering Giant Lobelias and vivid Red Hot Pokers—this is the best place in Ethiopia to spot the endangered Simien wolf, the rarest wild canid on earth. The plateau teems with life, including giant mole rats and a variety of birds of prey. Keep an eye out for the elegant Wattled Crane and the endemic Spot-breasted Plover. Continue to windswept Tullu Dimtu, Ethiopia's second-highest peak at 4,377 metres, before returning to the lush Harennna Forest. Here, enjoy more birding and wildlife opportunities around the lodge, where you may encounter olive baboons, Guereza monkeys, bushbuck, and if lucky, glimpses of elusive creatures like leopards, wild dogs or even lions. (BLD)

## **MAY 8: FRI 22 MAY 2026 - BALE MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK - DINSHO - HAWASSA**

Leave Bale Mountains Lodge and return across the breathtaking Sanetti Plateau, descending toward the Dinsho area—home to the headquarters of the Bale Mountains National Park. This scenic region, inhabited by the Oromo people, offers some of the best opportunities to spot Ethiopia's rare and endemic wildlife. Keep watch for Menelik's Bushbuck, the elegant Mountain Nyala, and, with luck, the elusive Simien Fox. Bird enthusiasts will delight in sightings of the Blue-winged Goose, Spot-breasted Lapwing, Abyssinian Longclaw, Wattled Ibis, and Rouget's Rail, among many others. The area also supports a healthy population of mammals such as warthogs, bohor reedbuck, and Guereza monkeys. Further on is the lakeside city of Hawassa, arriving in time to relax before dinner. (BL)

## **DAY 9: SAT 23 MAY 2026 - AMORA GEDEL MARKET - SODO - ARBA MINCH**

After breakfast, visit the serene shores of Lake Awassa, a picturesque freshwater lake framed by lush vegetation and rolling hills. Stop at Amora Gedel, the bustling local fish market, where fishermen unload their daily catch and large flocks of pelicans and storks gather, unbothered by their human companions. Take a leisurely walk through the nearby park where the striking black-and-white colobus monkeys swing through the treetops, and soak in the rich birdlife that makes this region a paradise for nature lovers. Afterward, drive southward, stopping for lunch in Soddo, before continuing on to Arba Minch, where you'll settle in for a two-night stay. (B)

## **DAY 10: SUN 24 MAY 2026 - LAKE CHAMO - DORZE ETHNIC VILLAGE - ARBA MINCH**

After breakfast, set out on a memorable boat trip across Lake Chamo—one of the highlights of Nechisar National Park. Glide across the water as you enjoy close-up sightings of hippos wallowing in the shallows and Nile crocodiles basking along the shoreline, some of the largest in Africa. In the afternoon, travel to the highland village of Chenchä, home of the Dorze people, famed for their intricate cotton weaving and distinctive beehive-shaped houses. These towering structures are crafted from bamboo and enset leaves, and reflect one of Africa's most iconic traditional architectural styles. Spend time browsing the colourful local market, where you can admire (or purchase) beautifully woven garments, including the prized Shama cloth—used for Gabbi robes and brightly patterned Netelas. It's a vibrant, sensory journey into the heart of Ethiopian highland culture. (B)

# ITINERARY

## **DAY 11: MON 25 MAY 2026 - KONSO ETHNIC VILLAGE - KONSO**

This morning, travel south to the striking hills of Konso, where a local guide leads you on a walk through one of the region's traditional hillside villages. The Konso people are renowned for their skillfully terraced farmland—now UNESCO World Heritage-listed—and their vibrant culture, which includes the carving of grave totems (known as waka) and the production of fine handwoven textiles. Wander through the winding stone-lined paths of a kanta (fortified village), where communal pavilions known as mora serve as centres for learning and protection. Learn how the young men sleep here at night, maintaining long-standing customs of community life and guardianship. As you explore, you'll encounter the verdant moringa trees, neatly tended fields, and glimpses of Konso daily life, from cotton weaving to cattle herding. This enriching cultural experience concludes with an overnight stay in a lovely lodge offering expansive views over the Southern Rift Valley. (B)

## **DAY 12: TUE 26 MAY 2026 - HAMER ETHNIC VILLAGE - TURMI**

Continue the journey south to the remote town of Turmi, close to the Kenyan border and a vibrant centre of Hamer culture. Spend time in a traditional Hamer village, where the people are known for their distinctive appearance and rich traditions. Both men and women take great pride in personal adornment—colouring and styling their hair with ochre and clay, oiling their bodies, and wearing intricate beaded jewellery and metal bracelets. The Hamer are especially famed for their moonlight Evangedi dances and the spectacular bull-jumping ceremony—a dramatic rite of passage where young men leap across a row of bulls to mark their transition into adulthood. (B)

During our two-night stay, we'll enquire locally about the possibility of attending one of these rare and culturally significant events. With luck, we may be in the right place at the right time to witness this unforgettable tradition. (B)

## **DAY 13: WED 27 MAY 2026 - KORCHO - KARO ETHNIC VILLAGE - TURMI**

Following an early breakfast, set off across wide savannah and acacia-dotted landscapes en route to the village of Korcho, dramatically set above the Omo River. This is home to the Karo people, masters of body painting. Using white clay and natural pigments, they transform themselves into living artworks with striking designs applied to their faces, arms, and torsos—purely for aesthetic expression and personal creativity. Their unique hairstyles, often sculpted and adorned with ochre and ostrich feathers, add to their bold visual identity, especially in preparation for dances and festive gatherings. After this immersive cultural encounter, return to Turmi with time to explore the bustling local market—an excellent opportunity to observe daily life, interact with local tribespeople, and browse traditional handicrafts. (B)

## **DAY 14: THU 28 MAY 2026 - KEY AFER - ARI ETHNIC VILLAGE - JINKA**

After breakfast, set off for Jinka with a special stop at the bustling Thursday market in Key Afer—one of the most vibrant and culturally rich markets in the Omo Valley. Here, members of the Hamer, Bena, and Tsemai tribes converge to trade everything from vegetables and honey to jewellery and livestock. Women wear beaded skirts and elaborate hairstyles coated in red clay and butter, while men don feathers and beads in carefully styled plaits. It's a sensory feast of colour, rhythm and tradition. Continuing on to Jinka, you'll arrive in the homeland of the Ari people—considered one of the most culturally and economically prominent groups in the region. With a local Ari guide, explore the villages and learn about their clan-based society, traditional house paintings (known as bartsi), and local crafts. See how they brew a traditional sorghum-based liquor and produce pottery using age-old techniques. Warm and welcoming, the Ari offer visitors an authentic and engaging look into daily life in southern Ethiopia. (B)

## **DAY 15: FRI 29 MAY 2026 - ADDIS ABABA**

This morning, take a mid-morning flight back to Addis Ababa. For those keen to enjoy some final shopping before the journey home, there's time to visit one of the city's most beautiful art galleries—an inspiring space showcasing contemporary Ethiopian creativity. You'll also stop at a large and well-stocked souvenir emporium, the perfect place to pick up locally made crafts, textiles, jewellery, and keepsakes to remember your time in Ethiopia. It's a relaxed and enjoyable way to round off your journey. (B)

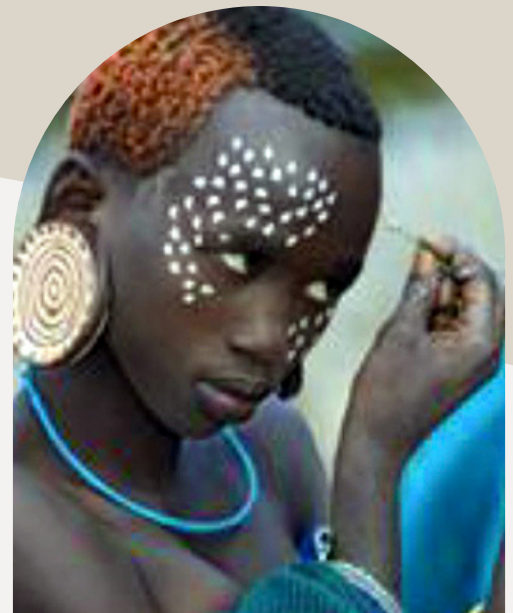

You can book your flights online or via your travel agent.

Emirates, Qatar, and Etihad Airlines have connections to Addis Ababa through the Gulf. Qantas and Thai Airways have connections with Ethiopian Airlines through Singapore and Bangkok respectively.

Your arrival transfer is included however, your departure transfer is not. We can organise a departure transfer on request.

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# BOOKING CONDITIONS

## RESERVATION AND DEPOSIT

A non-refundable deposit of \$1000 is payable on all tours. This deposit must be paid to Byroads, and each participating client must complete the Byroads Booking form. You agree to accept these conditions when paying a deposit for your tour and completing the Booking Form. Your Byroads tour booking will only be confirmed once the deposit and completed booking form have been received. These Booking Conditions form the basis of the contract between you and Byroads.

## PAYMENT

All payments must be made directly to Byroads by bank transfer.

## FINAL BALANCE

The balance of your tour payment is due 60 days prior to the start of your tour. If, for any reason, the balance payment is not received by the due date, Byroads reserves the right to treat such failure to pay the balance as a cancellation and to apply the appropriate cancellation charges.

## CANCELLATION BY YOU

If, for any reason, you cancel your tour booking, Byroads shall apply the following cancellation penalties. Charges are per person:

- Cancellation up to and including 60 days prior to departure, forfeiture of the total deposit
- From 59 to 45 days prior to departure, 30% of the tour price shall be retained
- From 44 to 31 days prior to departure, 50% of the tour price shall be retained
- Within 30 days prior to departure, no refund will be made.

In addition to the above charges, cancellation fees may also apply to any domestic airfare component of your tour. No refund will be made after your tour has commenced or in respect of lost or unused tickets, hotel coupons, meals or any other services not utilized.

## CANCELLATION BY BYROADS – Prior to Travel

If, for any reason, Byroads is forced to cancel a tour before it commences, Byroads may offer a transfer to an alternate departure, or all monies paid by you in respect of the tour will be refunded, less any unrecoverable costs. Unrecoverable costs may include but are not limited to monies paid to service providers, airlines, transportation companies, travel agencies and hotels associated with your tour.

## AMENDMENTS

Up to and including 60 days prior to the departure of your tour, any amendment to a confirmed reservation may incur a fee of \$50 per change per file. From 59 to 30 days prior to departure, any amendment to confirmed travel arrangements may incur a fee of \$100 per change per file. Once documents have been dispatched, any amendment may incur a fee of \$150 per change per file.

## TOUR PRICES

Byroads tour prices and provisional tour prices are based on tariffs and prevailing rates of exchange when tours were costed. Prices are subject to change without prior notice. In the event of fluctuations in currency exchange rates, service providers' tariffs, fuel prices or any other cost that affects the price of your tour, Byroads reserves the right to adjust tour prices at any time up to the day of departure.

## TOUR OPERATION

Although Byroads will endeavour to ensure that tours are operated as advertised, an express condition of making a reservation is the acceptance by you that the tour itineraries, schedules, advertised accommodation, sightseeing and mode of transportation as outlined in the Byroads brochure and/or supplied in the pre-departure information are subject to change without prior notice.

Unforeseeable circumstances such as force majeure, epidemic, pandemic, adverse weather conditions, floods, earthquakes, airline flight rescheduling, technical faults with transportation and road conditions may also have a consequential effect on the tour's content. Any decision made in respect of tour services provided by Byroads to reroute or amend the itinerary due to the above or similar circumstances shall be at the sole discretion of Byroads. Byroads shall not be liable for any claim whatsoever arising from such events that affect the schedule and content of your tour.

If Byroads is forced to cancel your travel arrangements after your trip has commenced due to reasons outside of its control, it will provide you with a refund of recoverable third-party costs only.

## HEALTH AND FITNESS

Byroads operate soft adventure tours. All participants must have a reasonable degree of physical fitness and be healthy. Before travelling with Byroads, you must familiarise yourself with any health requirements applicable to the areas you will be travelling. This includes obtaining any compulsory vaccinations or medical tests that may be required for entry into your country of travel.

You are responsible for having the correct entry and exit documents for your visiting countries. Byroads will assist in providing up-to-date information but is not responsible for any changes that may be made by governments.

## ACCEPTANCE OF RISK

You acknowledge that the nature of the tour is adventurous and that participation involves a degree of personal risk. You will be visiting places where the political, cultural and geographical attributes can present dangers and physical challenges greater than those present in our daily lives. We use information from foreign government departments and reports from our own contacts in assessing whether the itinerary should operate. However, you must acquaint yourself with all relevant travel information and your itinerary. You acknowledge that your decision to travel is made considering this information, and you accept that you are aware of the personal risks attendant upon such travel.

## PASSPORTS AND VISAS

Ensure your passport has a minimum of six months validity remaining, as this is an entry requirement in many countries. Upon booking, visa requirements will be advised once Byroads has received your passport details. Visas are required for a number of our tours, and it is your responsibility to obtain them.

## ITEMS NOT INCLUDED IN TOUR COST

The cost of your Byroads tour does not include international airfares, airport departure taxes, unspecified meals, optional sightseeing, additional transfers, gratuities for hotel staff, guides and tour leaders, items of a personal nature such as laundry, phone calls, etc. or any other incidental expenses.

## TRAVEL INSURANCE

It is an express condition of travelling with Byroads that you have comprehensive travel insurance to cover you for the duration of your tour. This should include full cover for any medical expenses and repatriation if required. It is highly recommended that you take out travel insurance when you pay the deposit to guard against any unforeseen circumstances that can lead to your need to cancel your tour. If you rely on complimentary travel insurance offered through your credit card company or bank, you should ensure that it is suitable for your tour. Some of the policies offered by these institutions may not offer adequate coverage. You must provide the policy number, insurance supplier details and emergency contact number to Byroads before your documents are issued.

We contract with a network of companies, government agencies and individuals to assist in the running of our tours as agent for these third parties. We are not responsible for the acts and omissions of these third parties. To the fullest extent permitted by law:

(i) Any liability for any loss, death, injury or damage which you may suffer (directly or indirectly) in connection with or arising out of your participation in a tour, or any breach of the Booking Conditions, is excluded;

(ii) You release Byroads and its officers, employees, agents and representatives from any liability and expressly waive any claims you may have against us arising out of, or in connection with, your participation in a tour;

(iii) Any condition or warranty which would otherwise be implied by law into these Booking Conditions (Implied Warranty) is excluded.

To the extent an Implied Warranty cannot be excluded, our liability in respect of the Implied Warranty is limited to (in our absolute discretion): (a) the provision of a similar tour to an equivalent value or (b) a refund of the total amount received by us from you in connection with your booking.

Any claim by you is excluded to the extent that it is for indirect or consequential loss, loss of profits or economic loss (however it arises) or for indirect, special, punitive or exemplary damages.

## APPLICABLE LAW

The laws of Queensland, Australia, govern these Booking Conditions to the fullest extent allowable. Any disputes in connection with a tour or these Booking Conditions must be initiated in the courts of Queensland.
